In North Carolina, Masonry has again proven what it means to meet upon the level.

Piedmont-Pioneer Lodge #685, AF&AM, rich in tradition like the many others in this State of fifty-six thousand Masons, is also "Traditionally" White.

Enter Mr. Joseph Adegboyega. In 2002, Mr. "A" wanted to become a Mason, so he went through the usual steps and was accepted unanimously by his Lodge to receive the degrees of Masonry. Brother Joseph was born in Nigeria and had become the first Black Mason in North Carolina.

In 2008, Brother Joseph became Worshipful Adegboyega, the Master of Piedmont-Pioneer Lodge, the first Black Master of what had previously been traditionally White. Tradition is a powerful, cherished part of who we are, yet I ponder the situation of Masonry regarding its membership and find that progress is an even more powerful entity. Progress that allows us to truly meet on the level is no less than destiny itself. Progress that allows us to close the gap of perpetual distance is a goal worthy of attempt.

We all try to see the internal qualities in men, but again, our "tradition" outwardly may show the world another

reality. These subtle differences we all have, make us so much more diverse, so much more unique, and so much more on the level with all who seek light.

My Brothers, we can benefit from this example. We have men in our neighborhoods and workplaces that would be excellent Masons. We need only be receptive to their quest to become Masons.

There has been some change in the rules from 2007, as we are now only required to use the sitting Master, both Wardens and Senior Deacon. All other positions may be

filled by any Master Mason in California (except for Inspectors and current Grand Officers). Please contact our Worshipful Master if you are interested in participating. The concept behind these Ritual Competitions is not to discourage Lodges from participating because they may feel unable to field a worthy team, but rather to motivate and encourage all Lodges to better perfect their Ritual capabilities so that we may the better be enabled to pass on the beautiful lessons of Masonry to our new Candidates - which is the entire reason for our Ritual in the first place. A poorly exemplified Degree leaves the Candidate wondering what sort of or-

ganization we are, and what benefit he may receive from becoming a Mason. But all three Degrees done properly instills many long lasting and important impressions on him. It motivates him to pursue a deeper understanding of our principles and often will plant the seed of desire to contribute to our Fraternity in some significant capacity in the future.

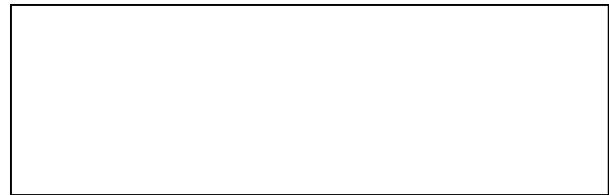
